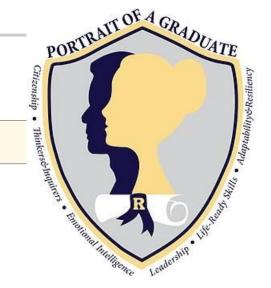

- Obtainment of sustainability grant awards across >the district.













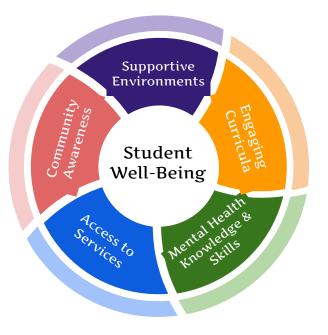


District Goal 4- Health & Wellness
