



- ✘ School Performance Reports and standardized measures represent an element to which schools should examine practices to facilitate improvement.
- ✘ These measures are contingent upon participation in order to provide meaningfully useful data.



This graph presents the percentage of the enrolled students who were chronically absent for the past three years.








